



Georgia's Coastal Retreat

Georgia's Coast stretches approximately 100 miles between the Savannah and St. Marys Rivers. In this unique region you can wander isolated beaches, tranquil marshes and cobblestone streets. Founded in 1733, Savannah, Georgia has the nation's largest registered Urban Historic Landmark District. Visitors flock to Georgia's first city to experience the abundance of southern charm and historic structures that Savannah claims.

Uncover magnificent live oak trees draped in Spanish moss, antebellum mansions overlooking picturesque squares, art galleries and unique "low country" restaurants. After touring the nooks and crannies of the city's famous historic district, including the newly renovated Broughton Street shopping district, head to Tybee Island, Savannah's Beach, for a climb up the lighthouse and a casual beach visit. Savannah's accommodations continue to grow with the addition of the brand new AVIA and Bohemian hotels.
